Thank you for your interest in the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Program at Vernon College.

Vernon College offer three **RN Transition Track** Programs. The following programs are for the students that have completed all or most of his/her general education requirements. LVN to RN and Military to RN and Paramedic to RN students will follow the same curriculum, referred to as the LVN to RN "Transition Track.

- LVN to RN Transition and Re-admission Tracks are designed for the student who is currently an LVN/LPN.
- **Military to RN Transition Track** is designed for the student who has completed military training as an Air Force Medic, Army Combat Medic, or Navy Corpsmen".
- Paramedic to RN Transition Track is designed for the student who is currently a
 paramedic.

To ensure completion of all necessary steps to apply for the ADN Transition Track Program as a new or re-admission applicant, students are advised to utilize the Vernon College Home Page, Career and Technical Education (CTE) Program Student Checklist, and ADN Pathways Page.

The Transition Track begins in the summer semester and encompasses three semesters of nursing courses, or 1 year of study. The curriculum involves 2-4 days a week each semester for classroom, lab, and/or clinical experience.

Required Transition Track semester credit hours (SCH) fall below the full-time financial aid requirement of 12 SCH and will affect your disbursement. For SCH specifics, see the "Course Timeline" posted on the ADN Pathways Page. The Transition Track requires 21 semester credit hours (SCH) of general education, 7 SCH of related requirements, and 24 SCH of nursing/RNSG courses (see catalog for degree requirements). The general education and related requirement courses must be completed prior to enrollment in the first semester of the ADN Program. If a student does not have the basic computer literacy skills, it is highly recommended that he/she complete basic computer course, COSC 1301. Potential ADN students will be required to maintain cumulative 2.75 or higher GPA on the following courses listed:

[#] A grade of C or higher must be achieved for admission consideration.

GPA calculations used on the **Vernon College ADN Program Admission Point System** are based solely on the preceding required prerequisite courses. Courses not required for admission to the ADN Program will not be used to calculate the GPA.

*BIOL 2401 Anatomy & Physiology I, BIOL 2402 Anatomy & Physiology II, BIOL 2420 Microbiology courses must be taken no more than ten years prior to the first class day after admission to the ADN Program.

Any RNSG course(s) taken 3 years or more before entering the Transition Track are invalid/expired and may prevent acceptance into the ADN Program. Any student failing to complete any of these courses (withdrawal or failure) with a "C" or better will be allowed to retake that individual course one time only. If the student is unable to successfully complete one or more of these RNSG courses on the second attempt, the ADN Program failure/attempt rules will apply and he/she will not be eligible for admission. Students with a total of 2 or more failures in RNSG/ADN Program courses (excluding Nursing Pathophysiology) are not eligible to enter and/or continue in the Transition Track.

**RNSG 1311 Nursing Pathophysiology course must be taken no more than three years prior to the first class day after admission to the Transition Track. Any student failing to complete the course (withdrawal or failure) with a "C" or better will be allowed to retake the course one time only. If the student is unable to successfully complete the course on the second attempt, he/she will not be eligible for admission to the ADN Program. RNSG 1311 is not included in the ADN Program failure/attempt rules (see the ADN Program Handbook).

RNSG 1115 Health Assessment, RNSG 1146 Legal and Ethical Issues in Nursing, and RNSG 1301 Pharmacology are required courses in the nursing curriculum and <u>may</u> be taken prior to acceptance into the Transition Track by LVN/LPNs, Air Force Medics, Army Combat Medics, or Navy Corpsmen or Licensed Paramedics only. Health Assessment and Pharmacology may be taken with the Summer Transition course but this is <u>not</u> recommended. Legal and Ethical Issues in Nursing must be taken in the fall semester if not completed before admission to the ADN Program Transition Track. If these courses are completed prior to admission, it will improve the student's admission points and ranking.

MATH 1314 College Algebra **or** MATH 1332 Contemporary Mathematics I **or** MATH 1342 Elementary Statistical Methods is recommended and allows a student to have additional points on the Vernon College Admission Point System Calculation (APSC) Rubric.

All RNSG courses utilize a numerical grading system with grade reports recorded using the standard alphabetical system. This system differs from most college level courses. In order to achieve acceptable competency levels, the minimum passing score is **78.** The instructor will give each student, in writing, the requirements for each unit or course of his/her responsibility. Number grades and corresponding letter equivalencies:

ADN - Transition Track Checklist:

- Advising Appointment: all nursing students are recommended to schedule an advising appointment with a nursing advisor. This link is posted under "Nursing Advising" on the ADN Pathways Page.
- ADN Program Admission Point System Calculation (APSC): review the APSC sheet posted on the ADN Pathways page for review. Selection is based on the number of applicants, applicant ranking according to the APSC system, and receipt of application documentation by the application deadline.
- ☐ **<u>Licensure/Transcript</u>**: all applicants will be required to upload the following documentation as applicable.
 - o LVN/LPN License
 - Military SMART/Joint Services Transcript with appropriate documentation ["USAF4NO" skill identifier, "Army 68W", or "Navy Corpsman" (HM3 course completed, NER-HM-006 or equivalent)]
 - o Paramedic License

Entrance Exam Scores (HESI A2): □

- Applicants must take the exam at an approved on-site testing center. Remotely proctored exams are not valid.
 - O Vernon College Testing Center Appointment
 Student is allowed 2 appointments between the two testing locations for
 Vernon College. Added appointment dates students create beyond the closest
 two scheduled dates will be removed. A student failing to appear for a
 scheduled appointment will result in using 1 of their 2 attempts for the Vernon
 College Testing Center. Any scheduled appointments that are not
 canceled within 48 hours during the business week will count as a student
 attempt.
 - O <u>Prometric On-site Testing Center</u> Elsevier official copy of the HESI exam results must be requested by applicant to be sent directly to the nursing department for approval. A fee may apply.
- Exam must cover Math, Reading Comprehension, and Anatomy/Physiology only.
 - o **Recommended** passing composite score is 78
 - Students scoring <78 will only be considered if positions are available after evaluation of those with the recommended score of >78
 - o Required composite score is 70
- Applicants may repeat the exam 1 time only (2 attempts total) within 12-month period.
- Exam scores can be no more than 12-months old on the first day of program classes.
- Online Nursing Application: will be posted by the end of October for Spring and the end of January for the Fall with general instructions for submission. All applicants are required to have a Vernon College e-mail address to submit application. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the application is filled out in its entirety and all documentation is uploaded.
 - "My VC" student account and address will determine the APSC "Resident of County Service Area" point value. See APSC requirements posted on the pathways page.

Letter of Explanation: only re-admission students are required to upload a letter of explanation with the nursing application. Please explain in the letter the reason for being unsuccessful in the nursing ADN Program/Transition Track and why you feel you will be successful on this attempt (be specific). Re-admission to the Transition Track is possible ONLY for those students who passed the RNSG 1327 Transition to Professional Nursing course during their previous admission. The student will re-apply as a new student in the Transition Track. Selected applicants will retake all nursing courses required after admission including, the summer Transition to Professional Nursing course. RNSG 1311 Nursing Pathophysiology (prerequisite course) will only need to be retaken if it has exceeded the 3year limit by the first day of class. Re-admission is a ONE-TIME opportunity. Re-admission applicants will be considered after selection of all new applicants. **Nursing Department Confirmation of Application & Notification of Status Process Email:** applications are not valid until applicants receives a confirmation of application & notification of status process email by the nursing department. Confirmation email will be sent to the student email.

Vernon College nursing programs requires accepted students to purchase a device for use with ExamSoft and Nursing Central. Electronic devices are used in clinical and classroom settings.

If a student prefers to use only one device, iPads are compatible with both ExamSoft and Nursing Central.

ADN - Transition Track Selection:

ADN Transition Track students with a failure of one course in the previous enrollment, the Two Failure/Two Attempt Rules continue to apply. The initial failure will count as the 1st failure and, if a student fails a course in the new enrollment, it will count as the 2nd failure and will result in dismissal/administrative withdrawal from the program. Re-entry will be granted no more than one time.

Selection is based on the number of applicants, the **Vernon College ADN Program Admission Point System,** GPA in nursing courses previously completed, available classroom/clinical space, receipt of application paperwork in the ADN Department by the application deadline, teacher/student ratios, Board of Nursing (BON) recommendations, accreditation status, and other factors (see the ADN Student Handbook) will determine the acceptance of new and re-admission students. Selected re-admission applicants are required to retake all nursing courses.

Seat are limited. Because the selection date is dependent upon many variables, the selection date may vary each semester. The department will e-mail all students a notification letter identifying their application status after the selection date. Students who are not selected into the program this year or who decline a position must re-apply to be considered for the next cohort.

ADN applicants are reviewed in order of application groups:

- ADN New Applicants
- ADN Re-admission Applicants
- ADN Re-entry Applicants
- ADN Nursing Transfer (if cohort offered)

All student acceptance to the nursing program is tentative, pending final review of program requirements and completion of eScreen (drug screening) with negative results.

Student Record After Selection:

If selected, a Canvas Course New Student Link will be included in the acceptance letter. Students are required to visit this link in a timely manner. Detailed information will be posted to prepare the student for the first day of class.
