❖ **Review program outcomes, assessment methods/results, and workplace competency**

Robin Lockhart asked the faculty member, Mary Rivard, to review the following information with the committee.

Program outcomes

1. Create a **Safe and Effective Care Environment** - promotes the achievement of client outcomes by providing and directing evidence-based nursing care that enhances the health care delivery setting in order to protect clients and health care personnel.
Implement Effective **Management of Care** Techniques – employs and directs evidence-based nursing care that enhances the health care delivery setting to protect clients and health care personnel.
2. Promote **Safety and Infection Control** – implement measures to protect clients and health care personnel from health and environmental hazards.

3. Advocate **Health Promotion and Maintenance** - provides and directs evidence-based nursing care that incorporates the knowledge of expected growth and development principles, prevention and/or early detection of health problems, and strategies to achieve optimal health.
4. Promote and Support **Psychosocial Integrity** - provides and directs nursing care that promotes and supports the emotional, mental and social wellbeing of the client experiencing stressful events, as well as clients with acute or chronic mental illness.
5. Promote and Support **Physiological Integrity** - promotes physical health and wellness by providing care and comfort, reducing client risk potential, and managing health alterations.

❖ **Approve assessment methods and results**

Mary Rivard reviewed the following information with the committee.

Community-Based Nursing is the capstone course for the ADN Program. The course includes the Hurst NCLEX Review with Elevate course and the HESI Exit Exam. Each student is required to take two HESI Exit Exams and the Vernon College Comprehensive Final (VCCF) in the spring semester. The highest HESI score plus VCCF combined must equal 975 or better. If not passed, the student will be required to repeat the Hurst NCLEX Review and attend remediation in the summer semester.

82 passed in the Spring

5 repeated the course

All 5 passed the repeat course in the Summer

❖ **Program Specific Accreditation Information and Requirements (if applicable)**

Mary Rivard reviewed the following information from the Board of Nursing below:

Ongoing approval status is determined biennially by the Board based on information reported or provided in the program's NEPIS and CANEP, NCLEX-RN® examination pass rates, program compliance with this chapter, and other program outcomes. Certificates of Board approval will be mailed to all Board-approved nursing programs biennially in even-numbered years.

(1) Compliance Audit. Each approved professional nursing education program shall submit a biennial CANEP regarding its compliance with the Board's requirements.

(2) NCLEX-RN® Pass Rates. The annual NCLEX-RN® examination pass rate for each professional nursing education program is determined by the percentage of first-time test-takers who pass the examination during the examination year.

(A) A minimum of eighty percent (80%) of first-time NCLEX-RN® candidates is required to achieve a passing score on the NCLEX-RN® examination during the examination year.

(B) When the passing score of first-time NCLEX-RN® candidates is less than 80% on the examination during the examination year, the nursing program shall submit a Self-Study Report that evaluates factors that may have contributed to the graduates' performance on the

NCLEX-RN® examination and a description of the corrective measures to be implemented. The report shall comply with Board Education Guideline 3.2.1.a. Writing a Self-Study Report on Evaluation of Factors that Contributed to the Graduates' Performance on the NCLEX-PN® or NCLEX-RN® Examination. Within one year of the submission of the Self-Study Report to the Board, the program shall provide to Board Staff evaluation data on the effectiveness of corrective measures implemented.

Plans are in development for applying to ACEN (Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing) for national program accreditation. Candidacy/initial accreditation cost is approximately \$13,321. Hopeful for 2023-2024.

Eligibility requirements for the governing organization/institution offering the nursing program seeking initial accreditation with the ACEN

1. The governing organization/institution is legally authorized to provide a post-secondary education program in the state or country in which the governing organization/institution and nursing program is physically located.
2. The governing organization/institution is legally authorized to grant the credential (degree, diploma, or certificate) for the nursing program seeking accreditation.
3. The governing organization/institution is accredited or approved to pursue accreditation by a [governing organization/institutional accrediting agency recognized by the ACEN](#); however, this does not apply to programs outside the U.S. or its territories.

4. For governing organizations/institutions included in section C, subsections 1, 2, 3, and 4, that does not hold governing organization/institutional accreditation by a governing organization/institutional accrediting agency recognized by the ACEN:
 - a. The governing organization/institution must be approved to pursue accreditation by a governing organization/institutional accrediting agency recognized by the ACEN; and,
 - b. The governing organization/institution must be accredited with a governing organization/institutional accrediting agency recognized by the ACEN before the ACEN Board of Commissioners makes its initial accreditation decision for the nursing program(s) seeking initial accreditation with the ACEN.
5. For governing organizations/institutions included in section C, subsection 2, that do not hold or are ineligible to hold governing organization/institutional accreditation by a governing organization/institutional accrediting agency recognized by the ACEN, the governing organization/institution must be approved by a supervisory state education department/public school system/district before the ACEN Board of Commissioners makes its initial accreditation decision for the nursing program(s) seeking initial accreditation with the ACEN.
6. The nurse administrator of the nursing program is responsible for immediately informing the ACEN Chief Executive Officer (CEO), in writing, of any change of status with any agency that accredits and/or approves the governing organization/institution. The notification must occur before the ACEN Board of Commissioners makes its initial accreditation decision.
