Success through Inquiry: Inquire-Discover-Engage



QEP Snapshot. "Success through Inquiry" is an inquiry-based learning Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) initiative designed to enrich student educational experiences at Vernon College. The concept of inquiry-based learning (IBL) centers on students' ability to formulate a question or hypothesis, collect relevant and appropriate information or data, analyze and evaluate that data for accuracy, and subsequently present their findings in a discipline appropriate manner (demonstration, presentation, research paper, etc.).

IBL is a "best-practice" teaching strategy designed to facilitate independent and collaborative knowledge building. Students formulating their own questions have the anticipated benefit of increasing motivation and perceived relevance all while taking increased responsibility for their learning. The objective of the proposed IBL-QEP initiative is to embed IBL learning strategies into courses across the curriculum for all students, thus creating a culture of inquiry at Vernon College. Courses enhanced with IBL learning strategies will provide students with opportunities to engage with and generate material in new and innovative ways, thus equipping Vernon College graduates with marketable, professional skills for success upon graduation.

QEP Key Benchmark Metrics. Throughout the 7-year QEP process, data collection will primarily be garnered from core assessment results, CCSSE and SENSE surveys, SIIR II and ESCR reports.
