Evaluation of facilities, equipment, and technology	Roger informed members that with this year's Perkin's money, the school was able to purchase a Hunter RFT22 Road Force Balancer.
Advice on selection and acquisition of new equipment and technology  External learning experiences, employment, and placement opportunities	Members of the committee agreed that the program must continually update equipment to keep pace with the technology that entry level techs require.  Roger told members that Expert Tire hired three students, Patterson of Bowie hired two graduates, and Patterson Honda hired one graduate. Roger expressed gratitude to the three companies for partnering with Vernon College.  Roger also told members that this semester he sent his students to the Automotive Service Consultant class where they observed professionals in the auto business for a day. Once they were through shadowing, they were assigned to write a paper about what they experienced and what if any improvements needed to be made. He thanked Vernon Auto Group, O'Reilly Auto Parts in Vernon and Wichita Falls and Goodyear in Wichita Falls for allowing his students to shadow their employees.  Roger explained that he had guest speakers in a few of his courses. He thanked Mike Wood and Fred Smith from Nitrous Express and Tommy Keeter from KPE Racing.
Professional development of faculty	Roger took part in the in-house training session for Blackboard which helped him enhance his classes and allowed him to offer more supplementary engaging hybrid classes. He told members that he will be attending educational breakout sessions at SEMA next month in addition to completing update training through Parts Plus.
Promotion and publicity about the program to the community and to business and industry	Roger will be participating in the first Vernon College Preview Day held on October 23 in addition to the Sophomore Roundup on November 20.  He visits area high schools. There are several tours at the Skills Training center throughout the year which give Roger a chance to talk to area High school and Jr high School students. He displays the drift car at local car shows.  Roger asked members to please contact him if they had any female employees that they would be willing to send out to assist in marketing the program at any of the promotional activities.
