## **MINUTES**

MINUTES	
Key Discussion Points	Action/Discussion/Information and Responsibility for Follow-up and Reporting
Welcome and Introductions	Robyn welcomed and thanked the advisory members for their willingness to serve. They introduced themselves and stated their positions and the agency they represented.
Purpose of Advisory Committee	Dr. Gary Don Harkey explained purpose and importance of an advisory committee. Their expertise in the field ensures the college is sustaining the ground floor of what is going on in Emergency Medical Services.
Elected Officers	Jon nominated Roger Ritchie for chair and Kenny seconded. Jon nominated Donald for recorder and Kenny seconded. Both nominations were unanimously agreed by all committee members.
Reading/Approval of Previous Minutes	Roger asked the committee to review the previous minutes. Jon made the motion to approve the minutes and Kenny seconded the motion. The minutes were passed by unanimous consent.
Old Business:	National Accreditation Process: Executive Analysis/Site Visit  Roger moved to Old Business. Robyn provided the committee with the Executive Analysis Accreditation Self Study. She informed the committee the accreditation site visit had been set for February. Jon and Kenny both inquired about the efficiency rate on the current paramedic class. Robyn reminded the committee with the testing change in Fall of 2014 it started with the intermediate class and would not be able to produce accurate results until that class has completed. Robyn continued the low efficiency numbers are a direct reflection of the limited clinical site, as well as access to all areas while at hospitals. The committee had an extensive
	conversation on acquiring more clinical sites. Robyn discussed revisiting

	Kell West and reaching out to the Womens Clinic to speak with the Mid- Wives. The committee members suggested speaking with Comanche County Memorial Hospital in Lawton, Cooks Children's Hospital in Ft Worth. Both students present agreed they would not have a problem whatsoever traveling for the clinical portion of the program if needed. The committee had no further questions or recommendations at this time.
Continuing Business:	
Preceptor Program Implementation	Roger moved to Preceptor Program Implementation. Robyn provided feedback on the preceptor's progress and reminded the committee the preceptors receive 4 hrs. Continuing Education for their efforts. Eric said that the training is going much better now. He believes students can be evaluated better if they are paired with the same preceptor from EMT to Paramedic. He would receive enriched feedback from the preceptor. Kenny asked how his preceptors were doing and that he would continue to reinforce strong preceptor training at AMR. The committee questioned wither the students would be punished if the preceptor was sick or on vacation. Robyn stated it would be worked out so the student would not be effected. The committee made no recommendations.
WFFD Advanced EMT Training	Roger moved to WFFD Advanced EMT Training. Jon stated that there were several stumbling blocks at first in regards to the pass rate on the NR exam. The fire department purchased EMS Testing, a tool for producing results on both deficiency and efficiency. EMS breaks down the student results matching the curriculum physically showing where they are lacking ability. The students would not be able to retest until their scores are ranking in the 70 to 90 percentile. Jon reiterated what a difference it made on the entire classes pass rate. Dr. Harkey stated that the nursing program had to implement a similar tool. The nursing program requires the students to pass the NCLEX before they are allowed to take State Boards. Robyn will work on a pricing proposal for both the College's fee and the student's fee to introduce at the Spring Advisory meeting. The committee agreed and were very interested in obtaining the learning tool for the EMS Program.

Review/Approve program outcomes, assessment methods and results	Roger moved to Review/Approve Program Outcomes. Robyn provided the committee a handout that outlined the EMS Program Outcomes. The committee reviewed the outcomes and were satisfied with all areas. Jon made the motion to approve the EMS Program Outcomes and Kenny seconded. The committee voted unanimously.
Review program curriculum /courses/degree plan 1) Proposed Curriculum Change: Combine Advanced Courses 2) CoAEMSP: Minimum Number of Patient Contacts 3) CoAEMSP: Evaluation System	Roger moved to Review Program Curriculum/Courses/Degree Plan. Robyn informed the committee, per National Registry the students do not have to take AEMT. They can move directly from Basic to Paramedic. The committee entertained the idea of marring the classes for advanced and paramedic. They discussed the possibility of having mini-mester as well. The committee will revisit during the spring meeting.
must use valid and reliable exams	Robyn presented a copy of the required CoAEMSP Interpretations of the CAAHEP Standard and Guidelines for minimum number of Patient Contacts. The committee discussed the limited clinical sites will impede the students ability to obtain all minimum patient contacts. The students will have to be diligent with their paperwork, checking to see if one patient meets more than one criteria. The limited number of pediatric cases will have to be well documented by the student themselves. The committee agreed with minimum patient contact hours Robyn outlined.

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	Kenny made the motion to approve minimum patient contacts and Donald seconded. The committee vote was unanimous.
	Robyn introduced EMS Testing, as discussed in WFFD Advanced EMT Training, as the tool VC needs to be compliant with CoEMSP evaluation system. EMS Testing would ensure VC is using valid and reliable exams. The committee's discussion included the success the fire department has shown after implementing EMS Testing. Jon made the motion to include the EMS Testing fee to the EMS Program, Kenny and Donald seconded. The vote was carried unanimously.
