Mary Rivard welcomed the committee and began the introductions.

Shana Drury reviewed the purpose of the advisory committee and opened the floor for volunteers or nominations for chair, vice-chair and recorder. Kitty Howard volunteered for chair, Connie Skidmore volunteered for vice-chair and Lori Page volunteered for recorder.

Kitty Howard began the meeting with new business seeing no old business.

Review program outcomes, assessment methods/results, and workplace competency

Kitty Howard began the meeting by going over program outcomes, assessment methods/result, and workplace competency. She asked the faculty, Mary Rivard, to go over these listed below with the committee.

Dr. Mary Rivard reviewed the following information and how it related to the NCLEX

Program Outcomes:

1. Provide a **Safe and Effective Care Environment** - contributes to the enhancement of the health care delivery setting and protects clients and health care personnel. Provides **Coordinated Care** – collaborates with health care team members to facilitate effective client care.
2. Promote and support **Safety and Infection Control** – contributes to the protection of clients and health care personnel from health and environmental hazards
3. Incorporate **Health Promotion and Maintenance** practices - provides nursing care for clients that incorporates the knowledge of expected stages of growth and development, and prevention and/or early detection of health problems.

4. Foster and support **Psychosocial Integrity** - provides care that assists with promotion and support of the emotional, mental and social wellbeing of clients.
5. Promote and Support **Physiological Integrity** - promotes physical health and wellness by providing care and comfort, reducing client risk potential, and managing health alterations.
 - a. Provide **Basic Care and Comfort** - provides comfort to clients and assistance in the performance of activities of daily living.
 - b. Provide **Pharmacological Therapies** - provides care related to the administration of medications and monitors clients who are receiving parenteral therapies.
 - c. Foster **Reduction of Risk Potential** strategies - reduces the potential for clients to develop complications or health problems related to treatments, procedures or existing conditions.
 - d. Promote and support **Physiological Adaptation** - participates in providing care for clients with acute, chronic or life-threatening physical health conditions.

Assessment methods and results

Kitty Howard asked the faculty, Dr. Mary Rivard, to explain in more detail the assessment methods and results.

Dr. Mary Rivard reviewed the information below and the reasons for changing to the HESI products that are also being used in the ADN Department.

HESI Exit testing began with the August 2020 cohort. Each student has three chances to pass with a 900 or better. If a student fails to make a 900 or better but has at least 850 on one exam, he/she is eligible to take the Vernon College Comprehensive Final Exam. The highest HESI score plus Vernon College Comprehensive Final combined must equal 950 or better. If not passed, re-education will occur in the following semester.

Approval of workplace competency (course or exam)

Kitty Howard asked the faculty member, Mary Rivard, to tell the committee about the competency and how the students have performed on the competency.

Dr. Mary Rivard explained the following data represents NCLEX-PN exam takers from 2017 program completers and program testers, 2018 information is not currently available. Dr. Rivard did note that the performance of our graduates was higher than the passing performance outcome.

VNSG 1115 Disease Control and Prevention - Study of the general principles of prevention of illness and disease, basic microbiology, and the maintenance of aseptic conditions.

Identify characteristics of common microorganisms; discuss the methods of preventing illness through utilization of standard precautions; and describe principles of aseptic techniques.

VNSG 1122 Vocational Nursing Concepts - Introduction to the nursing profession and its responsibilities. Includes legal and ethical issues in nursing practice. Concepts related to the physical, emotional, and psychosocial self-care of the learner/professional.

Discuss the personal adjustments essential to the development of the vocational nurse; identify the role of the licensed vocational nurse; and discuss the legal and ethical responsibilities in vocational nursing practice.

VNSG 1133 Growth and Development - Study of the basic aspects of growth and development throughout the life span. Focus on growth and development of the individual's body, mind, and personality as influenced by the environment.

Identify the stages of growth and development throughout the life span; and list the factors which influence growth and development.

VNSG 1227 Essentials of Medication Administration - General principles of medication administration including determination of dosage, preparation, safe administration, and documentation of multiple forms of drugs. Instruction includes various systems of measurement.

Demonstrate accurate dosage calculation; demonstrate safe medication administration; and accurately document medication administration.

VNSG 1320 Anatomy and Physiology for Allied Health - Study of the structure (anatomy) and function (physiology) of the human body, including the neuroendocrine, integumentary, musculoskeletal, digestive, urinary, reproductive, respiratory, and circulatory systems.

Identify the structure of each of the body systems; describe the functions of each body system; and discuss the interrelationship of systems in maintaining homeostasis.

VNSG 1423 Basic Nursing Skills - Mastery of basic nursing skills and competencies for a variety of health care settings using the nursing process as the foundation for all nursing interventions.

Demonstrate safe and competent basic nursing skills; describe how each step of the nursing process relates to nursing care; and discuss the implementation of basic nursing skills in a variety of health care settings.

VNSG 1431 Advanced Nursing Skills - Application of advanced level nursing skills and competencies in a variety of health care settings utilizing the nursing process as a problem-solving tool.

Demonstrate safe and competent advanced nursing skills; implement the steps in the nursing process and describe how each step relates to nursing care; and discuss the implementation of advanced nursing skills in a variety of health care settings.

VNSG 1332 Medical – Surgical Nursing II - Continuation of Medical-Surgical Nursing I with application of the continuum in a variety of health care settings.

Explain the components of the health-illness continuum; assess prevalent medical-surgical conditions affecting the patient with surgical conditions.

Dr. Mary Rivard discussed the revisions with the committee.

Proposed at this time the students will be required to have prerequisite Anatomy and Physiology I before they can enter the program and then as co-requisites Anatomy and Physiology II and Growth and Development may be taken before or during their first semester in the program. The committee asked if there would ever be a time where the students will be required to pass a HESI test before entering the program. Dr. Rivard stated that the department has a plan to begin using the HESI A2 Entrance Exam in the future. It would test students over math, reading comprehension, and anatomy and physiology.

Dr. Rivard was asked what she thought that would do to applications for the program. Dr. Rivard stated that they expected it would cause a slight decrease possibly for the first year. However, if the students have this exam it would bring in more qualified students.

Kitty Howard asked the committee for a motion to approve the program revisions as presented.

Peggy Kaufmann made a motion to approve the revisions as presented.

Reisa Johnston seconded the motion.
