Review goals and objectives	Provided hand-out of goals & objectives. Members felt the goals & objectives are stated appropriately.	
Workplace competencies	Members agreed that the workplace competencies are current and no changes were needed.	
Program revisions, curriculum/course review	Members discussed a reduction in hours from 63 to 60 for the Associate degree for the program. Members voted unanimously to move COSC 1301 Introduction to Computing from required to elective status for both the Associate and certificate and to change Welding Codes to a 4 SH course with 80 contact hours (3-2). Members also voted unanimously to remove MCHN	

	1438Basic Machine Shop I and MCHN 2403 Fundamentals of CNC from the electives of both the Associate and certificate.	
Evaluation of facilities, equipment, and technology	Chaz explained his plans to upgrade the lab equipment and will phase out 1 o 2 older weld machines each year and replace them with up-to-date ones. Students will have experience on both the latest models as well as the older ones which they are likely to use on the job after they graduate.	
.Advice on selection and acquisition of new equipment and technology	Members suggested that Vernon College invest in a computerized welding system. Chaz will research this and include it in budget planning next spring if he determines that it will be beneficial to the students and employers.	
External learning experiences, employment, and placement opportunities	Currently one student was hired at 3T Fabricators, one student was hired at Eagle Railcars, one student was hired at JV Industrial, and three students were hired at Peerless.	
Professional development of faculty	Chaz attended various faculty development sessions put on by Vernon College. He will attend training for the AWSD1.1 for code weld tester certification in Houston next summer.	
Promotion and publicity about the program to the community and to business and industry .	Since the Tech Prep program was closed, recruiting efforts have been conducted by the instructors, Jessica Sutherland, and Sharon Winn. Sophomore Roundup was November 1st where 106 high school sophomores came and toured the Skills Training Center and all the programs Vernon College receives telephone calls on a regular basis asking about the welding program. Word of mouth has proven to be the best publicity. There are several commercials about the various programs offered at Vernon College. Tours are scheduled at the Skills Training Center throughout the year.
