2011 Approved Criteria for awards to be presented at Honors Program

Faculty Choice Award:

Each full time Vernon College faculty member may give one award to one deserving student. The award is not based on grades or GPA but <u>solely on faculty choice</u>. Some examples would be a student who may have met one or more of the following criteria:

• who had perfect attendance

- improved the most
- been a leader in your class
- has been an active participant
- best overall student
- turned in every assignment
- had the best attitude
- tried the hardest

Non Scholastic Awards (clubs and organizations):

To be selected, the student must:

- Be at least a second semester participant in the club/organization with a Vernon College G.P.A. of 2.0.
- Have demonstrated potential, leadership, citizenship, service, perceived ability, vision, and exemplary behavior.
- Be enrolled in the immediate previous fall semester or current spring semester in a minimum of nine (9) hours in college-level academic transfer courses or six (6) hours of workforce education and training courses.

Scholastic Awards (**major revision**)

To be selected, the student must:

- It is up to the faculty to decide who is qualified for an academic honor
- Academic honors are based primarily on a student's grade
- Other criteria such as honesty and integrity should also be considered but they are not the primary criteria for an academic honor
- There is no requirement as to the numbers of hours a student has to have in order to qualify

• Each full time faculty member would be eligible to choose one student. It is not required that any faculty member must choose a student, if that faculty member feels that there is no one deserving of an academic honor.

This selection criteria was passed unanimously at the April 9, 2010 Faculty Senate Meeting.

Student of the Year Awards

To be selected, the student must:

- Have earned 45 semester hours of college-level courses or one-half of any certificate program by the end of the immediate/current Spring I semester with a Vernon College GPA of 3.0.
- Have demonstrated potential, leadership, citizenship, service, perceived ability, vision, and exemplary behavior.

- Must earn at least 15 semester hours of college-level work at Vernon College. A minimum of nine (9) semester hours must have been completed at Vernon College prior to the end of the immediate Spring I semester with a GPA of 3.0 or above. Six (6) semester hours may be in progress.
- Be enrolled in the immediate previous fall semester or current spring semester in a minimum of nine (9) hours in college-level academic transfer courses or six (6) hours of workforce education and training courses.

Student of the Year Sub Committees

The Student of the Year Sub Committees will meet to choose the Student of the Year for each of the major instructional locations – Vernon, Century City and Skills Training Center. The Honors Committee Chair will collect nominations for Student of the Year and then verify that nominated students meet the criteria. All materials for all students who meet the criteria will be delivered to the Student of the Year Sub Committee Chair. The Sub Committee will then meet to review the applications and chose a Student of the Year.
