Title: Continuing Education Reports

Date of completion: November 2018

Highlights of data:

For 2017-2018, Continuing Education served 4768 unduplicated students. Total enrollment for 17-18 was 8,915 which includes all funded, community service, business and industry and kids college enrollments. Continuing Education offered a total of 1023 funded and non-funded courses for 2017-2018. The top three programs producing the most contact hours are as follows:

1. Correctional officer/jailer with 80,536 hours
2. CNA high schools with 65,072 hour
3. Police Academy with 32,384 hours

Contact Hours per location are as follows in the 2017-2018 Continuing Education reports:

Century City Center – 45,458 hours

Remote Sites – 72,382 hours

Vernon Campus – 7,924 hours

Skills Training Center – 129,572 hours

This is a total of 255,336 contact hours for 2017-2018 resulting in a 6.5% increase from 2016-2017 (239,741).

Continuing Education reports show 397 contract courses for Business and Industry and 440 courses for Kids College offered in 2017-2018.

Ethnicity ratios are as follows for 2017-2018:

White = 70.28%

Black = 10%

Hispanic = 16.07%

Asian = 1.87%

Indian = 1.38%

Other = .38%

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board standards state that Continuing Education should have at least a 90% satisfactory or better rating on the following: quality of course, outcomes met, and needs addressed. For 2017-2018 Continuing Education ratings are as follows:

Quality = 98.55%

Outcomes = 97.97%

Needs = 97.95%

This data is analyzed by the Directors and Coordinators of Continuing Education every year in order to make changes as necessary to the various programs, while also evaluating trends in the current market.
