

April 2013 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston

- The Senate and the House have passed their versions of the appropriations bill. It is now in the conference committee. The Senate added \$146.8 million to the original SB 1 for community colleges while the House only added \$49.3 million—a difference of \$97.5 million. Vernon College has a very vested interest in what comes from the conference committee and TACC as well as our lobbyist are hard at work to influence the outcome. The original SB 1 would reduce Vernon College funding by approximately \$600,000 per year of the biennium. The new Senate version, including additional money for insurance and retirement, would only reduce funding for Vernon College by approximately \$50,000 per year. The current version of the House bill would reduce funding for Vernon College by approximately \$375,000 per year and the House has added no money for insurance and very little for retirement. So, as you can easily see, Vernon College and all other community colleges will be watching the conference committee very closely.
- Bids are being accepted for the three additional new entryways at the Century City Center campus. The entry ways will replicate the new Northwest Entry way at the north entry, east entry, and southwest entry. Bids will be open on April 11. The project will be completed during the summer. Funding for the project comes from a specific grant from the Priddy Foundation.
- Plans for complete renovation of the Century City Center parking lot are continuing. Several scenarios are being discussed since the most recent cost estimate for the entire project has passed \$850,000. The project will probably need to be broken in to smaller pieces and accomplished over two years.
- The Faculty Senate forwarded a recommendation for a modification of the current bereavement policy to me earlier this semester. The board of trustees conducted discussion on the proposed revision at the March 20 meeting. The revision worded below will be an action item for consideration at the April 17 meeting.
 - Any employee who is absent because of the death of a member of his/her immediate family, which shall include aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, or other person who occupies a position of similar significance in the family of the employee for this purpose, shall be granted a reasonable amount of accumulated sick leave. However, the amount of sick leave in this category must not exceed five working days per calendar year. Employees must provide documentation (i.e. obituary, funeral program, etc.) for bereavement leave.
- The board of trustees addressed the issue of tuition and fee costs at the March 20 board meeting. The board of trustees approved the administrative recommendation of no increase in tuition and a \$5 per semester credit hour of the Institutional Service Fee (ISF) at each campus location. The ISF was raised \$15 per semester credit hour for internet/online courses so the cost would be the same as ISF cost at the Skills Training Center and the Century City Center campuses. In addition, the board approved a \$10 per semester credit hour waiver for ISF for all dual credit students taking course work.

<u>Instruction - Dr. Gary Don Harkey</u>

- The **Summer class schedule** has been completed and is posted on the website.
- The **Fall class schedule** is nearing completion.
- Both the Summer and Fall Advising and Registration Guides have been completed and are at the printer.
- The Course Schedule Advising (CSA) schedule for the spring and summer is currently under development. Course Schedule Advising Centers will open April 17 with online registration beginning April 24.

- Vernon College was represented at the recent Vernon ISD annual Family Learning Event by the Cosmetology (Darlene Kajs) and Continuing Education (Anne Patterson) Departments. Cosmetology Students provided demonstrations in hand care (including mini manicures) and VC Kiddie College shared information about upcoming summer events for children. Approximately 190 adults signed up for the event with their children and attendees were provided with Vernon College Bookstore bags to carry their complimentary items throughout the evening.
- On Monday, March 25th the VC **Surgical Technology Student Assn. (STSA)** donated supplies from the Wish List for the Rathgeber Hospitality House at United Regional Hospital. Supplies included, bleach, paper towels, napkins, and plates, plastic spoons, knives, and forks, disposable bowls, zip lock bags, Kleenex, and dryer sheets. The students in the STSA provided all the donations and were provided a tour of the facility to see how their donations would be used.
