

November 2013 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston

- The Vernon College Board of Trustees approved a revised Professional Development Policy for employees at the October board meeting. The Professional Development committee, composed of faculty and staff, worked hard for several months to revise the policy to ensure that employees are taking part in professional development that the College is providing substantial in-house professional development, and that employee professional development is being correctly documented for future accreditation processes. Please take time to review the policy to assure appropriate participation.
- Several meetings have been held with individuals in Wichita County to begin discussions on a Branch Campus Maintenance Tax (BCMT) opportunity. Additional meetings are planned for the next several weeks. Public meetings will be conducted in the spring semester to engage community members, students, civic groups, and governmental entities. The tentative timeline of activities would result in a county wide vote in May 2015 if the plan moves forward without interruption. A concise presentation of the concept is attached to this monthly update.
- The ceremony to officially name the United Supermarkets Student Success Center located inside the northwest entry way of the Vernon College Century City Center was well attended and very appreciated by United personnel. The partnership has produced two \$75,000 scholarship endowments which will help many future students. The partnership also produces significant name recognition with a major community industry for Vernon College. Future partnerships are being explored for other significant functions/areas of the building at Century City Center.

I have a proposal that I am confident will benefit Wichita County high school students, community college students, community members, and business and industry. The proposal would:

- Support establishing zero cost tuition and fees for all Wichita County high school students in dual
 credit academic, technical, or Early College High School classes saving each student and/or
 school approximately \$450 per course. There are currently 295 Wichita County students enrolled
 in Vernon College dual credit classes for the 2013 fall semester that would have benefitted from
 this initiative.
- Support lowering the cost of tuition for Wichita County residents attending Century City Center, Skills Training Center, Sheppard Learning Center or other Vernon College Wichita County sites. This would allow them to pay the same tuition rate as Wilbarger County resident students—basically a 45% reduction in the tuition cost for each class. Total cost of tuition and fees per semester credit hour (SCH) would decrease from \$160/SCH to \$118/SCH. This would save \$630/semester for a student taking 15 SCH per semester based upon 2013-2014 board approved tuition and fee rates. There is an additional 1768 Wichita County students enrolled in Vernon College classes for the 2013 fall semester that would have benefitted from this initiative.
- Support the cost of relocation and enhancement of the Skills Training Center to provide vital training for Wichita County business and industry. The current facility is owned by the Wichita County and is proposed for expansion of county jail operations in the future.
- Support Vernon College operations, programs, and services including instruction, student services, fiscal operations, physical plant, maintenance, and technology in Wichita County.

The proposal is a Branch Campus Maintenance Tax (BCMT) limited to \$.05/\$100 of assessed valuation to benefit the students and business and industries of Wichita County as well as supporting Vernon College operations in Wichita County. There are several examples of a BCMT among Texas community colleges that support out of district operations. Two examples near Wichita County are Wise County which passed a BCMT to support Weatherford College operations in Decatur and the city of Graham which passed a BCMT to support North Central Texas Community College operations in Graham.

Texas' statutes permit the creation of a limited property tax to operate, maintain, and support a community college campus in a jurisdiction outside of its taxing district. Vernon College's taxing district is Wilbarger County. The purpose of the tax is to support college operations for instruction, student services, physical plant, and technology at a more adequate level than can be provided by tuition, fees, and state appropriations only. The BCMT may not exceed \$.05 per \$100 of assessed valuation in the jurisdiction. The proceeds of the BCMT may only be used in the area of jurisdiction that levies the BCMT. The cost to an individual with a \$100,000 home in Wichita County would be \$50 per year or \$4.17 per month to support the above initiatives.

Vernon College has significant operations in Wichita County that provide vital and affordable educational opportunities to community members as well as workforce training for business and industry in demand occupations and skills. Our goal is to improve and expand these operations and opportunities. I hope you will see significant value to our ideas—for Wichita County students, community members, and business and industry.
