

April 2018 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance – Dr. Dusty R. Johnston

- There were no contested elections for the Board of Trustees this cycle. When there is an unopposed election, the governing board must meet, accept a *Certification of Unopposed Candidates* and issue an *Order of Cancellation* declaring the election cancelled and the unopposed candidates elected. The *Order of Cancellation* must then be posted on Election Day at each polling place. The board took this action at the March 21 meeting.
- Vernon College utilizes a total of seven ITV classrooms—three on the Vernon campus and four at CCC. These classrooms are heavily used to deliver classes between campuses as well as to deliver classes to high schools through the Region 9 Service Center system. The equipment is outdated and expensive. We were able to budget to update two of the classrooms last summer. We anticipated updating two this summer. We are experiencing technical difficulty with all five that have not been updated. The budget has been scrutinized to reallocate funds to update all five this summer. This project does not have to be sent out for bids because the vendor has the approved state contract for these systems. This will greatly increase the quality and effectiveness of courses delivered by ITV.
- Cybersecurity has become a significant issue the last few years. As a participating Title IV (federal financial aid) institution we are required to comply with the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (GLBA), and as per the Federal Student Aid (FSA) Program Participation Agreement (PPA) and the Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) Agreement, post-secondary institutions must have GLBA safeguards in place. Institutions without GLBA safeguards may be found administratively incapable (unable to properly administer Title IV funds). Starting in FY 2018 institutions will be audited on securing student information. The draft audit language currently reads as follows: Audit Objectives – Determine whether the institution of higher education (IHE) designated an individual to coordinate the information security program; performed a risk assessment that addresses the three areas noted in 16 CFR 314.4 (b) and documented safeguards for identified risks. Suggested Audit Procedures a. Verify that the IHE has designated an individual to coordinate the information security program. b. Obtain the IHE risk assessment and verify that it addresses the three required areas noted in 16 CFR 314.4 (b). c. Obtain the documentation created by the IHE that aligns each safeguard with each risk identified from step b above, verifying that the IHE has identified a safeguard for each risk. Ivy Harris will work with Run Business Solutions and to take the lead on ensuring that Vernon College is in compliance in addition to her current duties as Coordinator of ERP/SIS. She is currently working to develop a draft Cybersecurity Policy and beginning to develop training for employees and students in regard to cybersecurity issues.
- A new opportunity to serve our students is coming to fruition from a recommendation that the administrative assistant to the Dean of Students position that became vacant due to a resignation be revised to a Career Services Coordinator. The position will work with graduates as well as regional business and industry to identify employment opportunities, assist students with applications, coordinate job fairs, and assist Vernon College graduates to gain employment. This is a great opportunity to improve organized job placement services for our students. Dona Crow will provide administrative assistant to all Student Services personnel on the Vernon campus.

- The Dynamics GP/ReqLogic/Greenshades follow-up set-ups are continuing to be refined and adjusted according to departmental needs.
