

December 2018 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston

- Many documents are updated on an annual basis as part of the thorough planning process implemented at Vernon College. One document is an updated Vernon College History of Focus on Student Success. I am adding this document as an attachment so all can use it as resource information.
- Dr. Crandall has worked with several employees and departments to develop a Community Resource Information guide. In many instances, students come to Vernon College with individual concerns and situations that need to be addressed in order for the student to be successful in school. Vernon College recognizes that these concerns, situations, and needs are wide-ranging. This Community Resource Information guide was created to assist our students and employees to find those needed resources for our students and their families. The Community Resource Information guide is also attached.
- The Wichita Falls Community Health Care system has finalized construction plans for the clinic at Century City Center. The bids for the project will be received in December and construction/renovation should begin in late January.
- The athletic department is conducting the search process for a new volleyball coach. Interviews are scheduled for the week of December 10 with four experience coaches to be interviewed. The goal is to have a new coach hired to begin the spring semester.
- A few days prior to Thanksgiving, there was extensive water damage to Skills Training Center due to a plug blow out in a main waterline that went through the ceiling space. Since Wichita County owns the building all insurance and rebuilding will be accomplished under the county's supervision. Carl Brinkley and others are working in cooperation with the county judge and commissioners to restore the facility to original condition as soon as possible.

Quality Enhancement/Professional Development - Dr. Donnie Kirk

- "Success through Inquiry" Quality Enhancement
 - "Success through Inquiry" QEP Plan SACS-COC Accreditation Reaffirmation Recommendation Response. The Success through Inquiry QEP plan was presented to the SACS-COC visiting team during the Accreditation Reaffirmation visit on Wednesday, October 24. The Success through Inquiry QEP is a "best practices" inquiry-based learning initiative aligned with the institutional mission of enhancing teaching and learning while providing rigor and quality for student success. Inquiry as pedagogy encourages students to 1) develop questions/curiosity regarding course content, 2) investigate that curiosity through research, 3) evaluate the soundness of their findings, 4) and subsequently share their newly constructed knowledge in a visible manner (group discussion, project, presentation, paper). The SACS-COC committee concluded that the QEP assessment plan "represents a multi-faceted approach to evaluate the success of the QEP through the triangulation of data sources across students and faculty, across multiple academic disciplines, and across periodic timeframes to capture data collection." However, the committee recommended that the institution (Vernon College) clarify the plan to directly assess identified student learning outcomes (noted above). The written response to the recommendation, which includes a focus report and amended QEP narrative, is due March 01
 - Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE): Spring 2019. Vernon College is registered to administer the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) in Spring 2019. The CCSSE is a product of the Center for Community College Student Engagement, a tool that helps institutions focus on effective educational practice and identify areas in which they can improve their programs and services for students. The survey asks about institutional practices and student behaviors that are highly correlated with

- o student learning and retention. This year and subsequent years, Vernon College will receive an additional 20 items on Guided Pathways, free of charge. See more about the CCSSE instrument here.
- Community College Faculty Survey of Student Engagement (CCFSSE): Spring 2019. Vernon College is registered to administer the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) in Spring 2019. The Community College Faculty Survey of Student Engagement (CCFSSE) elicits information from faculty about their perceptions regarding students' educational experiences, their teaching practices, and the ways they spend their professional time—both in and out of the classroom.
