

May 2018 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston

- There was not a contested election for the Board of Trustee positions at Vernon College. Bob Ferguson and Irl Holt will continue as board members while Ann Wilson filed for the position previously held by Joanie Rogers who chose to not run for reelection. The three members will be qualified at the May 9 board meeting.
- The Board of Trustees reviewed draft 1 of the budget at the April meeting. The draft includes additional funds for several campus projects, equipment requests, and the 1.5% step increase in the various salary schedules. The budget draft projected expenses exceed the projected revenue by just over \$200,000. The administrative team will continue to review the budget and make decisions to balance the proposed \$22,141,444 budget prior to budget approval in August.
- There are a few changes in organizational structure as a result of the retirement of Joe Hite, Dean of Admissions, Financial Aid/Registrar. Amanda Raines will assume the duties of Registrar and her position will be revised to Director of Enrollment Management/Registrar. She will supervise admissions, registration, and recruiting functions at all locations. Melissa Elliott, Director of Financial Aid will continue current duties and will provide additional leadership to financial aid functions at all locations. Both positions will now directly report to Jim Nordone, Dean of Student Services. This will eliminated one Dean level position.
- I continue to have email and telephone communication with Dr. Elizabeth Crandall, the recently hired Vice President of Instructional Services. I have provided her a great amount of information regarding the instructional component of Vernon College. I continue to be impressed with Dr. Crandall. I believe she will be a great asset to Vernon College.
- I want to publically thank Shana Drury, Greg Fowler, Joe Johnston, Paula Whitman, and Mark Holcomb for the leadership and extra work the past year to ensure the continuing success of the Vernon College instructional component.
