

April 2019 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

<u>College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston, President</u>

- The Vernon College Board of Trustees approved a SACSCOC Substantive Change to reactivate the EMS Paramedic program. Vernon College faculty and administration have been working to reactivate the EMS Paramedic Certificate for the past two years. The Emergency Medical Services Advisory Committee reviewed, approved, and recommended on Feb. 4, 2019 that VC reactivate the Paramedic Certificate for 2019-2020. Academic Council approved the recommendation and reactivation of the certificate on Feb. 15, 2019. The College Effectiveness committee approved the recommendation and reactivation of the certificate on February 22, 2019. There is still much work to do with the national accreditation agency, but the first step was the Vernon College board approval to submit a substantive change request to SACSCOC.
- Several programmatic discussions are ongoing to add or transition programs to meet business and industry needs, increase enrollments, increase tuition and fee revenues, as well as generate additional contact hours for the institution.
 - o Based on Wichita Falls community input, we plan to reactivate the Machining Program at Skills Training Center starting fall 2019.
 - Add a Barber component to the Cosmetology program as a night program at Vernon and at CCC beginning January 2020. Additional tuition and fee revenue and future state funding will offset funds for two instructor positions.
 - Transition the Medical Assisting program at Vernon and CCC as well as Dental Assisting program at CCC from non-credit to credit programs beginning January 2020. The demand for these programs is growing and the transition will make the programs eligible for student federal financial aid programs. Additional tuition and fee revenue as well as future state funding will offset increase in instructional cost.
 - Psychiatric Nursing Assistant as a short-term non-credit class on the Vernon campus beginning summer 2019 to meet demands of the local state hospital. Additional tuition and fee revenue as well as future state funding will offset instructional costs.
- Administration and division chairs have been in several meetings with WFISD administrators discussing several ideas including:
 - o Increasing dual credit enrollment, especially in career technical education courses—they are supportive
 - Vernon College use of the WFISD Career Education Center facility for additional night college classes they are supportive
 - o WFISD requested more general education dual credit classes taught by Vernon College prior to noon at the Career Education Center—we are very excited about this
 - WFISD support of a branch campus maintenance tax for Vernon College—they are generally supportive but cautious about any effect on the bond they will be proposing in November 2019
- The ERP system, Microsoft Great Plains, has been implemented for 18 months, and is operating very well. The SIS system, U4SM, has continually been delayed in final development and implementation. The Howard College president (HC also purchased this system) and Dr. Johnston met with Unit 4 company chief officials in late February to discuss concerns and challenges regarding implementation. The company assured the colleges that many of the delays have been overcome. A new release of the product is to be to each college by April 30 followed by a timeline for implementation and training.
