

June 2019 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston, President

- The Vernon College Board of Trustees approved several items related to program changes that must be processed as a SACSCOC Substantive Change:
 - SACSCOC Substantive Change notification to close a program--Administrative Office Technology has been on probation yearly since the 2013-2014 academic year because of low student enrollment. Fall 2018 enrollment did not meet VC minimum enrollment expectations. With the continued decrease in student interest, lack of graduates, and lack of meeting other state and local benchmarks, the program evaluation sub-committee recommends sunsetting (closing) the Administrative Office Technology program. It was the recommendation from the Program Evaluation Subcommittee to sunset the Administrative Office Technology program effective Fall 2019. The VC Academic Council approved this recommendation on April 12, 2019. The College Effectiveness committee approved this recommendation on April 26, 2019.
 - SACSCOC Substantive Change notifications for program expansion—to continue compliance with SACSCOC, Vernon College must notify SACSCOC of any intent to expand programs on the main campus or a previously approve off-campus site. The program expansions requiring SACSCOC substantive changes needing board approval were:
 - Barber—Level 1 Certificate—Vernon campus and Century City Center—effective January 1, 2020
 - Medical Assisting—Level 1 Certificate—Vernon campus and Century City Center—effective January 1, 2020
 - Dental Assisting—Level 1 Certificate—Century City Center—effective January 1, 2020
 - The VC Academic Council approved these program expansions on April 12, 2019. The College Effectiveness Committee approved these program expansions on April 26, 2019.
- The Vernon College Board of Trustees approved a new three year contract with Run Business Solutions for management of Information Technology operations. Vernon College posted a RFP for management of IT operations and proposals were to be submitted by April 18. Run Business Solutions has provided this service for nearly eight years through two RFP processes. Run Business Solutions has not increased the basic cost in five years. Vernon College has added additional services at a per service cost.
 - Run Business Solutions submitted the only proposal. The price for the manage services and operations remained the same including some new security measures that were implement this past year. Optional additions for Cyber Security as well business continuity and disaster recovery were included in the proposal. Also included were costs of services for website development and improvement well as the nursing application tool that were added two years ago. Year one cost is \$576,677 while year two and three cost is \$545,292.00.
- A contractor has been selected for the Wichita Falls Community Health Care Clinic. Garry David, Carl Brinkley, and Dr. Johnston met with the contractor, Rick Sims (architect), and administrators of the Wichita Falls Community Health Care Clinic on Friday, April 12, 2019 to discuss final renovation plans and timelines. A second meeting was conducted on May 29. Renovation should begin the week of June 3. The large-scale steel and concrete work will be complete prior to classes starting in August. A small area of the east parking lot will be fenced for the construction materials, etc. There will be some noise and dust during the first few weeks of the renovation.
- There continues to be positive conversations with David Farabee about the Branch Campus Maintenance Tax (BCMT) opportunity. A steering committee of eight interested Wichita County residents has been assembled. The first steering committee meeting will take place June 5 to update them about the process and the status of the feasibility study. Vernon College staff are working hard on the feasibility study to send to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board as a part the BCMT process. We have been in contact with the THECB staff for assistance. The plan is to present the request at the October THECB meeting.
