

April 2020 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

<u>College Governance – Dr. Dusty R. Johnston, President</u>

- At the March 11, 2020 Vernon College Board of Trustees meeting, the following was approved:
 - o Financial and Investment Reports as of February 29, 2020
 - o Certification of Unopposed Candidates and Order of Cancellation for May 2, 2020 Trustee Election
 - o Substantive Change to SACSCOC for the Cosmetology program
 - o 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan
 - o Tax Resale Deeds
 - o Reappointment of faculty for 2020-2021
- A Special/Emergency meeting of the Vernon College Board of Trustees was conducted on March 20, 2020 to adopt a
 resolution making certain delegations of authority to the President in order to efficiently and effectively prepare the
 college district in response to declarations of emergency announced by the United States, the State of Texas, and the
 City of Vernon, as well as in preparation for additional declarations of emergency in response to the COVID-19
 pandemic.
- The Texas Guided Pathways/SB 25/60x30TX Task Force has met for several months with the primary purpose to make recommendations for improvement to the current student advising process. They have done an excellent job. A brief description of recommendations include:
 - Adopt a universal student advisement model (proactive and appreciative rather than transactional) and implement with select faculty and student services personnel.
 - o Institute mandatory student advisement for all Vernon College learners (define mandatory intervals, for example, 15 credit hours, 30 credit hours, 45 credit hours, not to exceed one-year).
 - Restructure/reorganize job functions and have division of Student Services be responsible for the coordination of student advisement at Vernon College.
 - Continue to "front-load" career services training/planning to assist with ensuring incoming students are on their respective pathways and for "lighting- the-fire" as early as possible.
 - Continue to offer retention outreach services (after Title III Strengthening Institution's Grant has concluded) to at-risk students, and explore creative ways to bring outreach services "to scale" for Vernon College students in an effort to create and maintain student success.
 - o Procure new Student Information System (SIS) one that is state-of-the-art with regard to the entering, processing, and tracking of students.
 - o Reconfigure job title and responsibilities for the Director of Student Success Pathway, to take on leadership duties for student advisement at Vernon College.
 - o Empower division chairpersons and select faculty to create logical meta-majors for Vernon College.
 - o Refine and or create articulation agreements with colleges/universities where are our students most frequently transfer.
- The past month has been greatly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic resulting in the transitioning of face-to-face classes to online, numerous changes to practices and process in student services, and significant change to all college routine operations. Communication of these changes to students and employees has been a top priority.

- The Surgical Technology Student Association and Program Coordinator Jeff Feix attended the Texas State Assembly of the Association of Surgical Technologists Annual Business Meeting and Workshop. All students enrolled in the program attended and raised \$1960.00 selling t-shits and salsa.

 - Spring 2020 QEP Implementation Interrupted! Fall 2019 QEP Training Cohort (Cindy Coufal—English Instructor; Gisela Knightstep—Biology Instructor; Shelli Pendleton—ADN Instructor; Steven Underhill, Business Administration/Microcomputer Applications Instructor; and Amber Hunsaker—English Adjunct Instructor) began implementing IBL best practices in their Spring 2020 target courses. That implementation includes a pre-inquiry survey administered to students within the targeted course(s), the inquiry-based learning lesson plan implementation, and a post-inquiry survey students within the courses impacted. Update: Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the post-inquiry student survey will now be administered to students in the target courses electronically from the QEP Team.  - Spring 2020 IBL-QEP 101 Faculty Training Now in Session Extended! The Spring 2020 IBL-QEP 101 Faculty Training Cohort is now in session! Faculty who will participate in this 8-week IBL-QEP 101 course—the heart of our "Success through Inquiry" QEP initiative include Belinda Alberry—Mathematics Faculty; Michelle Alexander—History Faculty; Jason Scheller—History Faculty; Jon Schreiber—English faculty; and Clint Wagoner—Mathematics Faculty. Spanning February 14-April 17, the training takes place in a hybrid format, allowing faculty to meet three times, and complete most of the training in an online environment. Participants will complete the course following IBL prescribes methodology and come away with an inquiry-based learning implementation plan (IBLIP) ready to apply in their Fall 2020 courses. In addition, this "Year One" group will be prepared to mentor and assist other faculty in QEP implementation efforts 2019-2024. Update: Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, course deadlines have been extended to accommodate faculty while still garnering useful QEP data.
