

September 2020 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston, President

- The Vernon College Board of Trustees approved the proposed 2020-2021 budget. The proposed 2020-2021 budget has undergone tremendous scrutiny the past several months. The proposed budget is based on state revenue, tuition/fee revenue, and tax revenue based on the effective rate. The budget includes a very conservative estimate of tuition and fee revenue based on the 19-20 actual enrollment numbers. The budget included a 1.5% salary schedule step increase and institutionalize the three Title III grant positions since the grant ends September 31. The final approved budget of \$21,138,730 is nearly \$200,000 less than last year's budget. All employees contributed to successfully producing the effective and efficient budget.
- The Vernon College Board of Trustees approved updates to the Title IX policy. In the past year, there has been tremendous revision to federal policy regarding the issue of campus sexual misconduct. In response, Haven David and Kristin Harris were asked to review current policies, procedures, processes, and practices to be sure Vernon College meets current Title IX expectations and to make recommendations for improvement. The approved revisions will be placed appropriately in the Student Handbook and the Employee Handbook.
- The Vernon College Board of Trustees also approved:
 - o Investment Policies, Procedures, and Strategies as required by the Public Funds Investment Act
 - o 2020 Fall Continuing Education Schedule and Fees
 - o 2020-2021 Workforce Program Handbook updates
- The Vernon College Board of Trustees listened to an abatement proposal from Savion concerning the Adams Creek Solar project. The board will consider the abatement request at the September 9 board meeting.
- There are eight Vernon College employees participating in the fall VC Leadership Academy. The need and the encouragement to develop programs is well documented in literature. The Leadership Academy is designed as a thorough program of leadership training geared to community college needs. This will be the fifth offering of the academy. For the first time, the class will be conducted using Canvas and Office 365 TEAMS instead of in person meetings. The plan will be for individuals to complete assignments in Canvas and to conduct four TEAMS meetings on four Friday afternoons.
