

January 2021 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston, President

- Vernon College Board of Trustees approved to enter an energy savings agreement with Ideal Impact for the Vernon campus, CCC, and STC. Garry, Mindi, Lyle, Carl, and Dr. Johnston have been working with a company for a couple of months called Ideal Impact. The company began by specializing in energy audits and cost savings plans for churches in Texas. The company now has several hundred independent school districts as clients. They are just now entering the community college market—all clients are in Texas. Company employees have been on our campuses performing energy audits—looking at all heating and cooling that uses electricity or gas, thermostats/controls, automatic system control units, associated equipment, lighting, square footage, building plans and auditing our utility bills for the 12 months prior to COVID-19. The company fronts all the cost of improvements and is reimbursed from actual energy savings in an estimate of five years.
- Vernon College, City of Vernon, and Wilbarger County are in discussions with Tyson regarding a proposed tax abatement request from the company. The company is seeking abatement on a \$25 million improvement project. The City of Vernon is the lead entity on the project.
- As the spring semester begins, everyone is reminded of the professional review/evaluation process that takes place each spring. All supervisors should be scheduling professional reviews/evaluation soon.
- Division chairs and others have been in discussions with Vernon ISD, Harrold ISD, and Northside ISD regarding ideals to improve college-going rates of Wilbarger county residents. Initial discussions have produce the following ideas to be explored:
 - VC assistance completing the FAFSA
 - Exploring more local TSI testing or VC assistance with TSI testing
 - Explore more CTE dual credit
 - Automotive
 - Cosmetology
 - Welding
 - HVAC

- QEP Highlights
 - OEP Year Two, Spring 2021 Semester Recruitment Under Way. Recruitment for the IBL QEP 101 Workshop from the Division of Communication faculty is now under way. Structured in an 8-week hybrid series, "IBL-QEP 101" introduces participants to inquiry-based learning concepts and strategies while leading them through the IBL process. At the conclusion of the training, faculty participants have an inquiry-based learning implementation plan (IBLIP) ready for implementation within their courses for the following term. A mailer has been sent to faculty. Follow-up visits will follow.
 - ^o **Spring 2021 QEP Faculty Training Course.** The Spring 2021 QEP Training Course is currently undergoing edits and modifications. The workshop will run February 08 through April 02 for faculty within the Department of Communication.
 - Spring 2021 QEP Committee Session Calendar in Development. The Spring 2021 QEP Committee Session Calendar is currently in development. The committee, comprised mainly of faculty implementing the "Success through Inquiry" QEP initiative, will mainly cover issues related to the continued promotion, implementation, and assessment of the QEP.
 - ^o Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE). Vernon College will disseminate the 2021 Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) during the Spring 2021 term. The CCSSE is a well-established tool that helps institutions focus on good educational practice and identify areas in which they can improve their programs and services for students. Administered during the spring to mostly returning students, CCSSE asks about institutional practices and student behaviors that are highly correlated with student learning and retention. CCSSE serves as a complementary piece to the Survey of Entering Student Engagement (SENSE), with a more broad focus on the student experience.
 - ^o Community College Faculty Survey of Student Engagement (CCFSSE). Vernon College will disseminate the 2021 Community College Faculty Survey of Student Engagement (CCFSSE) during the Spring 2021 term. Developed in response to demand from the community college field, the Community College Faculty Survey of Student Engagement (CCFSSE) elicits information from faculty about their perceptions regarding students' educational experiences, their teaching practices, and the ways they spend their professional time—both in and out of the classroom. Offered as a companion to the CCSSE student survey, CCFSSE is an online census survey that invites all faculty teaching CCSSE-survey eligible courses at participating colleges to contribute their front-line perspectives on student engagement. With a flat-rate fee regardless of college size, CCFSSE is an affordable way to create a faculty data set for comparison with student data. Perhaps more importantly,

CCFSSE provides colleges with an effective way to invite faculty into a college-wide conversation about student engagement and success while spurring interest in their CCSSE survey results.
