

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston, President

- The Vernon College Board of Trustees approve the following at the March 8 meeting:
 - Law Enforcement Grant Resolution—the proposed grant is to fund a trailer to provide the opportunity for moving the VC shooting simulator to our smaller counties that cannot make it to Wichita Falls for the training. The simulator breaks down into about 10 parts that can be moved safely to counties without damage. The plan is to do this at least once a quarter.
 - Prohibited Technology Policy-- On December 7, 2022, Governor Greg Abbott required all state agencies to ban the video-sharing application TikTok from all state-owned and state-issued devices and networks over the Chinese Communist Party's ability to use the application for surveilling Texans. Governor Abbott also directed the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) and the Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR) to develop a plan providing state agencies guidance on managing personal devices used to conduct state business. In addition to TikTok, Vernon College may add other software and hardware products with security concerns to this policy and will be required to remove prohibited technologies which are on the DIR prohibited technology list. Throughout this Policy, "prohibited technologies" shall refer to TikTok and additional hardware or software products added to this Policy. This proposed policy closely follows the Governor's suggested policy template.
 - o Reappointment/extension of faculty contracts for 2023-2034
- Dr. Mary Rivard presented an update to the VC Board of Trustees regarding the Associate Degree Nursing program seeking additional accreditation from the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). The purpose of the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) is to provide specialized accreditation for all levels of nursing education. It is recognized by the United States Department of Education (USDE) and Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) as a specialized accrediting agency. ACEN Accreditation requires strict compliance with rules and regulations that are more stringent than those required by most state boards of nursing.

As the nursing profession changes and evolves, many states now require Graduate Nurses to have education through a program with national accreditation. This can be through the ACEN or the Commission for Nursing Education Accreditation (CNEA). At this time, over 20 states require this endorsement. Graduates from programs without accreditation are being denied permission to sit for the NCLEX-RN in these states, resulting in graduates being unable to obtain their license to practice nursing.

Numerous four-year colleges and universities have followed suit and are denying graduates from nonaccredited programs permission to continue their education at the institution. Graduates from nonaccredited program are also being denied employment in some areas. Government related jobs, such as those with the Veteran's Administration, are denying employment to licensed nurses who graduated from programs without national accreditation.

ACEN accreditation will lead to increased stature for the Vernon College ADN Program and is likely to help in improving recruitment and retention of students.

- Softball had a very tough month of March. One bright spot was that Jenna Fabela was named NTJCAC Player of the Week for the week of March 12-18. A freshman infielder from Pharr, Texas, Fabela earned the NTJCAC Position Player of the Week honors after going 9-for-14 from the plate with an on-base percentage of .737 and a slugging position of 1,714. Overall, she batted .643 with two doubles, four home runs, seven runs scored and seven RBI. She also reached base five times via walks. Overall we went 7-13 for the month but there is not a lack of confidence in this team and they look to get back on the winning track.
- Baseball also had very rough beginning to conference play. Of the four teams that we faced to start conference, three of them, qualified for the conference tournament. Two of those are nationally ranked. Coach McIntosh is not down on his team and still has them playing at a high level. They will get back to their winning ways very soon and finish the season out on a high note.

- Volleyball recently underwent a change at the Head Coach position. Veronika Webb was named to the position after a year as the assistant for Rob Blakely. She brings a great amount of energy and volleyball knowledge to the program. She played at a high level and earned All-American Honors while at Texas Wesleyan. They have some upcoming matches in April and will finish up spring season on the 30th.
- Rodeo has been some time in on the road. This month they have been in Odessa, Sweetwater, and Snyder, TX. They also have been having to stay awhile at each by putting at least one contestant in the short go at each rodeo. Colton Leech placed 5th in the bulldogging and Trinity Gonzales also made the short go at Odessa. Cooper Norris split 5-16th with a 2.2 run at Ranger College's rodeo. Carsen Norris roped a 1.9 in the long go at Snyder and came back splitting 3rd through 5th. In the short go she roped another 1.9 for second in the average.
