

May 2023 Update

This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston, President

• Budget 2023-2024 draft 1—all initial budget requests were turned in by April 1. The administrative team worked hard to prepare the first draft of the budget. Draft 1 was presented to the board at the April meeting for review. I have been stating for several months that the 23-24 budget was going to be a hard one for several reasons. A budget is simply an estimate of a series of choices. We usually do a good job of estimating tuition and fee revenue based on previous year's actual enrollment. We are committed to basing 23-24 tuition and fee revenue on 22-23 actual revenue numbers. It will be a conservative estimate. Declining enrollment has a significant impact on tuition and fee revenue available for the operating budget. In addition, the new state funding system for community colleges is still being finalized in the legislative session. Each community college is aware of the minimum it will receive, but I am hopeful the new system will create an increase for Vernon College. We will not know the final outcome until mid-May when the legislative session is complete.

Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds (HEERF) have been extremely helpful to small, rural colleges that have had enrollment decreases. The funds have been used wisely, accurately, and appropriately. A large portion of the funds have gone directly to students to assist them to meet financial barriers. HEERF funds are not available for the 23-24 budget cycle.

- OEP Spring 2023 Faculty Workshop Completion. Four faculty from the Division of Math and Sciences completed the Spring 2023 IBL-QEP 101 Faculty Workshop. Successful completers include Xandy Gilmore, Elaine Naylor, Chris Kirby, and Tammy Majewski. DRJ Comments

An idea for strong consideration—A number of articles and recent conferences that I have attended have highlighted the need for students to feel connected. As I drove home from the Texas Guided Pathways conference, I challenged myself to think about what VC is really doing to provide the opportunity for student connection. I know we have many activities and events that students can engage, but are we really promoting, nearly insisting, that students connect. All the literature states that they want to/expect the opportunity to. At a minimum, in addition to the current functions/activities, I am proposing that each component and each division take ownership to develop and conduct one student engagement activity per semester. I am not prescribing the activity or event. I am suggesting that the event be planned and conducted with the primary goal of engaging/connecting with students in an informal fashion to make them feel welcome, comfortable, wanted, and connected to VC. If the president component, each VP component, and each division engage the respective faculty and staff to plan, coordinate, and conduct one event per
