- The plans to renovate the residence halls on the Vernon campus are being finalized. Potential contractors walked through the residence halls on Monday, February 24. Proposals are to be submitted by Thursday, March 6 at noon. A board selection committee comprised of James Brock, Ann Wilson, and Betsy Smith with assistance from architect Rick Sims will review the submitted proposals and select a contractor on March 6. The project is very time sensitive with a firm start date of May 10 and a firm completion date of August one. The renovation project includes, but is not limited to:
