

### This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

### College Governance - Dr. Dusty R. Johnston

• The majority of meetings, telephone conferences, and discussions this past month have been concerning the future of community college funding in light of the state budget deficit. Everything is a projection at this point, but most of the projections are not positive. The primary concern centers on the tremendous growth by Texas community colleges compounded by the certainty of reductions in funding in the next biennium. As a reminder, specific to Vernon College is that even though the projected increase in contact hour generation is 13.5% from the last biennium; the projected state average increase is 19.5%. In this scenario, if state funding is flat and held at current levels, any institution with less growth than state average would lose funding once the formula calculates distribution of state dollars. If state funding is reduced by 5-10% or even more, the situation becomes even less favorable for Vernon College and others that did not grow at the state average. The most current projections are that the reduction will be at least 10%. This level of reduction would be approximately \$1.2 million each year for Vernon College. The funding reduction would have to be made up with a combination of expenditure reductions and possible revenue increases to develop the 2011-2012 budget.

The administrative team has already met twice to closely analyze the current budget in regard to potential expenditure reductions in the 2011-2012 budget. The administrative team has also discussed several scenarios of revenue increases including potential tuition, fee, and tax increases. As the budget process for 2011-2012 begins, all departments can expect some decrease in departmental operating expenses, technology, and travel. All strategies to reduce expenditures and increase revenue will be explored. Of course, as any positions that become open due to attrition, retirement, or resignation will be scrutinized as to the necessity of filling the position. One top goal is that the budget reduction and the 2011-2012 budget process does not eliminate any current positions.

A second large issue is the budget reduction will significantly affect the funding for state health insurance. Currently, the state pays 100% of the employee cost of insurance and approximately 50% of added coverage for children or a family. Reduction plans being discussed include the state only paying 75% of employee insurance costs and several ideas to reduce the state subsidy for children or family coverage. All of these ideas are in discussion and are projections. No specific decisions will be clear until after the legislative session has been concluded this summer.

Information will continued to be communicated with faculty and staff as the legislative session gets underway and continues through the spring. The administrative team will be seeking input as the current budget is analyzed and the 2011-2012 budget begins to be developed. All revenue sources will be analyzed and all institutional expenditures will be scrutinized as we develop our plan continuing to offer excellent services to our students, our communities, and our employees.

- Construction and renovation projects continue to move forward. The renovation at the Skills Training Center is basically complete awaiting some final city inspections. It looks very nice. The baseball field expansion continues to progress on schedule with the metal building frame being mostly completed prior to Thanksgiving. The Century City Center renovation plans are becoming finalized. A great deal of good input has been received from faculty and staff and the final product will reflect this input.
- The auditors have been working hard on the audit of the 2009-2010 year. The audit will be presented at the December board meeting.
- The newest Vernon College Board of Trustee, Dr. Todd Smith, was sworn into duty at the November 17 regular board meeting. Dr. Smith is ready to work hard for Vernon College and is a great addition to the board.
