



This monthly report is intended to provide the Vernon College Board of Trustees, Vernon College Foundation Board members, as well as college faculty and staff, with updated information regarding significant college activities, issues, and accomplishments.

<u>College Governance – Dr. Dusty R. Johnston</u>

- The legislature is continuing to discuss House Bill 1 and Senate Bill 1 including several amendments as the appropriations bill eventually moves to the conference committee. The three big items for Vernon College are the appropriations for the instructional formula, appropriations for employee group insurance, and appropriations for employee retirement programs. The impact to Vernon College is estimated to be a total loss of \$850,000 to \$1.3 million dollars per year for the three appropriation areas. This estimate has increased because when the House amended its bill to include the four previously unfunded colleges, the funds came by prorating an amount from the other 46 institutions. At this point, a good estimate would be somewhere in the middle but probably more to the high side since the \$1.3 million represents the House bill and the House seems to be driving the appropriations bill at this time. In the early stages of the budget development process, the \$1.3 million reduction is driving the budget development.
- The approved increase in tuition and fees for 2011-2012 coupled with budget reductions and cost efficiencies will be important as the 2011-2012 budget is developed in attempt to meet the needs of Vernon College students, communities, and employees. The effort of all faculty and staff in the budget development process is very important and appreciated.
- The plans for the renovation of the Century City Center are in the final phases of development. The goal is to take bids in June and begin renovation in July.
- Several Vernon College Board of Trustee members will be attending the Governance Institute for Student Success facilitated by the Association of Community College Trustees and the UT Community College Leadership Program in Ft. Worth July 31- August 2. The conference will provide a unique opportunity to engage trustees and presidents in the national agenda to accelerate degree completion and improve outcomes for community and technical college students.
- Vernon College has been working with the Wichita Falls Chamber of Business and Industry, area high schools, and
 others for the past year in preparing to implement training and testing for a nationally recognized Career Readiness
 Certificate (CRC). The CRC, issued by ACT, is a portable, evidenced-based credential that measures workplace skills
 and is a reliable predictor of workplace success. Among its use by employers are screening, hiring and promotion, and
 targeting employee training and development. Vernon College is considering waiving the application fee for any
 potential student who possesses the credential as one method to encourage the credential in the workplace and the
 community.
- The VC Board of Trustees approved an Internal Posting policy for positions at the College. Most positions will still be posting locally, regionally, and nationally when needed. Certain positions when requested by the supervisor and approved by the president will be posted only for internal applicants (current employees). Once the applicant pool is considered, the decision will be made to either fill the position or to post externally. All other components of the hiring process remain the same.

<u>Instruction – Dr. Gary Don Harkey</u>

- Shana Munson, Sharon Winn, and Romona Vaughn recently attended the Texas Association of Career & Technical Educators (TACTE) Spring Conference in Austin. While there Sharon attended workshops on Perkins Funding and Romona attended the Tech Prep Directors meetings. Shana continues to serve on the TACTE Board.
- **Student Evaluations of Instruction** were completed during the month of April with 2769 students in 148 courses taught by 99 instructors having the opportunity to provide input. Results will be available in late May.
- The annual **VC Honors Convocation** was held on April 15th at the Wilbarger County Auditorium. Thanks to all VC instructors who participated and special kudos to Student Services for another outstanding job!
- The **Surgical Technology Student Assn**. (STSA) under the direction of Program Coordinator & Instructor **Jeff Feix**, held their annual Garage Sale fund raiser on April 9th. They received a record number of donations and raised \$2000.00, which is also a record for this annual event. They followed that up with a Hot Dog Lunch fundraiser @ CCC on April 28th. Proceeds from these fundraisers will be used to fund the groups' trip to the 2011 National Convention in San Francisco.

In *Waiting for Superman*, "Davis Guggenheim examines the breakdown of the American public school system. Guggenheim examines the causes of this educational epidemic and attempts to offer solutions to help put the system back on track". This third installment in the Spring 2011 VC Film Series was presented by **Jason Scheller** and was well attended with over 75 participants, the majority of whom stayed after the showing for discussion of the film.
- **Deana Lehman**, Director of Special Services, recently gave a presentation at the Association on Higher Education and Disability (AHEAD) Texas State Conference in Houston. Her presentation, <u>Shooting from the Hip: Doing More with Less</u>, was well attended with over half of the conference participants attending her presentation.
- English Instructor **Misti Brock** and her students sponsored the second annual Great American Bake Sale on Friday, April 29. Proceeds from the event benefit *Share Our Strength*, a national organization with the goal of ending childhood hunger in America by 2015. This year, they raised over \$500 through community and college-wide donations.
