Highlights of data: Two surveys were given to faculty during this reporting cycle regarding Professional Development. The Quality Enhancement Resource Inventory (QERI) Survey and a Professional Development Follow up Survey.

68 Instructors (64 full time and 4 adjunct) were surveyed in May during faculty development on the Quality Enhancement Resource Inventory (QERI) – results indicated:

- what hardware/software the faculty were using in the classroom
- if they had training on the hardware/software
- continual usage in the future
- interest in the hardware/software if not already using
