## **Highlights of data:**

The Student Instructional Report II (SIR II) survey was administered November 8-19, 2010. A total of 229 classes were surveyed with enrollments of 4,331 students. A total of 3,591 surveys were completed equaling an 83% response rate.

- B. <u>Communication</u> Range 2.82-4.98; VC Overall Mean = 4.41; National Comparative Mean = 4.39
- C. <u>Faculty/Student Interaction</u> Range 2.38-5.00; VC Overall Mean = 4.40; National Comparative Mean = 4.40
- D. <u>Assignments, Exams, & Grading</u> Range2.46-4.97; VC Overall Mean = 4.33; National Comparative Mean = 4.26
- E. <u>Supplementary Instructional Methods</u> Means not reported for this section
- F. <u>Course Outcomes</u> Range 2.15-4.88; VC Overall Mean = 3.92; National Comparative Mean = 3.88
- G. <u>Student Effort & Involvement</u> Range 3.14-4.90; VC Overall Mean = 4.01; National Comparative Mean = 3.88
- H. Course Difficulty, Workload, & Pace Means not reported for this section
- I. Overall Evaluation Range 2.25-5.00; VC Overall Mean = 4.04; National Comparative Mean = 4.05

Online courses were also selected to participate in this survey. As in previous semesters, the rate of participation was extremely low. Twenty-two courses taught by 19 different instructors and including 479 students were selected for the online survey. Only five courses received the minimum of five responses required to generate a report. A total of 35 students responded to the online survey equaling a 7.3% response rate. We continue to search for a solution to this dismal response rate for the online courses.

## Use of data:

Faculty and/or administrators may use SIR II data to:

- assess course and instructional outcomes
- pinpoint teaching strengths and improvement opportunities across disciplines, courses, classes, and instructors\*
- benchmark instructional effectiveness against national norms
- comply with accreditation/legislative requirements
