

“LECTURE” RECORDING GUIDE

What is your “lecture” recording goal? Begin by answering the following questions.

I am delivering content in a:

- face-to-face class
- online class
- both

My goal is to deliver content as a:

- primary source
- supplement to instruction
- review
- resource provided to students as needed

I plan to accomplish this goal by capturing/recording:

- audio of instructor
- video of instructor
- instructor’s PowerPoint
- audio/video of student participation
- other computer presentation materials
- other non-computer presentation materials

Next, review the tools available to you through the Quality Enhancement Resource Inventory (QERI).

VIDEO CAPTURING/RECORDING TOOLS

Wimba Live Classroom – best used to capture/record:

- two way interaction between student and instructor in an online class
- audio of instructor, video of instructor, instructor’s PowerPoint, audio/video of student participation, other computer presentation materials

NOTE: Limitations to audio/video quality – relies on strength of internet connection

Camtasia Software – best used to capture/record:

- content delivered using presentation materials via computer (e.g., PowerPoint, internet resources, software demonstration)
- audio of instructor, video of instructor, instructor’s PowerPoint, other computer presentation materials

NOTE: Limited to one way interaction between instructor/student

Camcorder – best used to capture/record:

- face-to-face classroom experience as a whole (e.g., instructor, student participation, non-computer presentation materials)
- lab/clinical demonstrations
- audio of instructor, video of instructor, audio/video of student participation, other non-computer presentation materials

NOTE: Limitations to audio quality and difficulty reading/viewing presentation materials
