Vernon College (VC) cordially submits a Substantive Change regarding the Certificate of Completion in Cosmetology. VC is approved to offer Certificates of Completion, Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Associate of Arts in Teaching, and Associate of Applied Science degrees 2019 Reaffirmation of Accreditation.

The Cosmetology program is not only under SACSCOC rules and regulations, but also accredited/licensed by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR). During the Texas 2019 legislative session, House Bill 2847 was signed into law mandating a decrease in the required number of clock hours for a student to be eligible to take the TDLR Licensing/Credentialing exam effective September 1, 2020. As a result, programs teaching 1500 clock hours must reduce to a minimum of 1000 clock hours.

Vernon College supplies, equipment, and facilities remain the same for the Cosmetology program. Student support services, operational, and managerial resources also remain the same.

Vernon College Modified Prospectus Substantive Change for Cosmetology

During the 2019 Texas legislative session, House Bill 2847 was signed into law mandating a decrease in the required number of clock hours for a student to be eligible to take the TDLR Licensing/Credentialing exam effective September 1, 2020. Vernon College offered a 42 semester credit hour (minimum 1500 clock hour) program in Cosmetology before legislation changed the law. With the approval of this substantive change, Cosmetology will move to a 30 semester credit hour (minimum 1000 clock hour) program. This results in more than a 25% decrease in semester credit hours.

Per Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 16, 83.120(a), the law mandates the following categories for Cosmetology: 800 clock hours in hair care, 100 hours in nail care, and 100 hours in skin care. It is up to the discretion of the college what courses will provide the most efficient use of time and supply the most effective student learning outcomes and curriculum. TDLR awards students 37.5 clock hours per semester credit hour. For example, students graduating from Vernon College will be awarded 1125 clock hours (30 SCH x 37.5 hr = 1125) which permits the student to be eligible to take the licensure exam.

All current faculty will stay on staff. All supplies, equipment, and facilities will continue to exist for the program. All student support services, operational, and managerial resources will continue at Vernon College. Oversight of the program will not change and remain in the hands of the Director of Cosmetology and Dean of Instructional Services. None of the above services will diminish in any way with the mandate of decreased clock hours.

Per the charts below, student learning outcomes are dictated by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board Workforce Education Course Manual (WECM). Program outcomes and assessment activities will remain intact. In essence, the only change is the number of clock hours awarded by TDLR and the number of semester credit hours awarded by the college.
