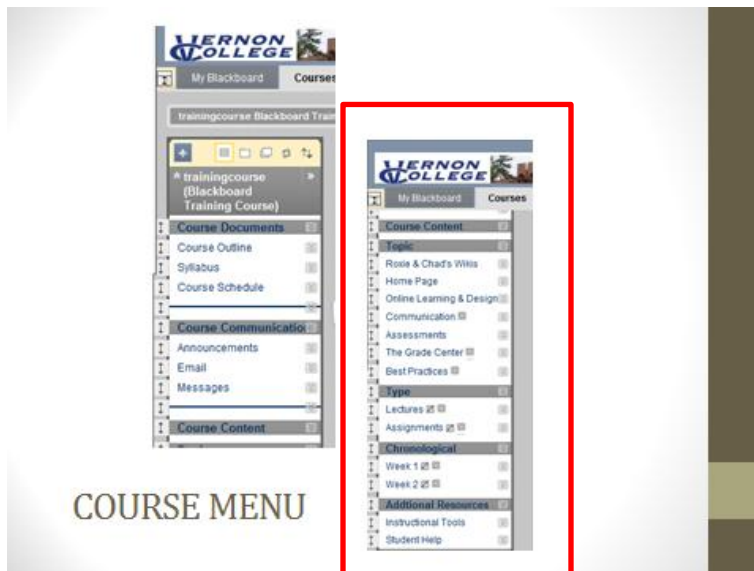
### TRAINING PHASE 1 (Dates March 28-April 8)
